Iowa State Fair Competition Rules and Info

Required Judging Attire:

1. **Business Interview Attire** for individual interview. Consider **Business Interview Attire** as something you would wear to a business function or a job interview. Your clothing may be age- appropriate but, in this case, still very professional. A business suit or a professional dress is accepted.
2. **Casual Wear** for a short interview and introduction at the fairgrounds Thursday and Friday afternoon. **Casual Wear** may consist of something you would wear to a banquet or casual church. Sundresses, skirts, jumpsuits, and capris are all appropriate.
3. **Formal Wear** for group discussion and crowning. (Keep in mind you have to walk up and down steps to the stage). Prom dresses or any other type of formal gown are acceptable.

Also needed:

1. Clothing of your choice for Tuesday/Wednesday dinner, Thursday/Friday lunch.
2. Casual clothes for free time at the hotel (swimsuit, cover-up, pajamas, etc.).
3. Miscellaneous (such as hair supplies, toiletries, snacks for hotel, optional spending money for Fairgrounds)

QUEEN CONTESTANT PACKING SUGGESTIONS

- Three or four **Casual Wear** outfits
- One or two **Business Interview Attire** outfits
- One or two **Formal Gowns**
- **Parade outfit** (something lightweight and casual- sundress, skirt, etc.)
- Dressy, lightweight jacket

- Slippers
- Comfortable shoes
- Swimsuit

- Band-Aids
- Extra spending money (for free time at the fair and snacks)

- Jewelry (nothing too expensive)

- Bobby pins (for crown)
- Sunglasses
- Extra pins for your sash
- Double-sided tape, scissors, needle and thread
- Cell phone
- Camera

Remember, you are the Queen, so please dress like one! You should stand out in the crowd, but you must also be comfortable, as you will be walking around the fairgrounds.

Please Note:

The judges often ask the same questions of various contestants so please do not discuss your private interview or group discussion with any other candidates. Judging results or judging forms are not released.

The Iowa State Fair is not responsible for valuables lost or stolen. Keep your room locked and your key with you.

IOWA STATE FAIR QUEEN COMPETITION

General Information

Housing Accommodations:

Housing accommodations are offered for queen candidates only (four contestants per room). The Iowa State Fair provides chaperones and staff so please do not bring anyone to stay with you.

Because our time is limited and space is tight, visitors are not allowed at the hotel during the competition. However, your family and friends are welcome to see you on the Anne and Bill Riley Stage on both Thursday and Friday afternoons, August 10th & 11th, at 4:00 p.m. They are encouraged to attend the crowning on the Anne and Bill Riley Stage, Saturday evening, August 12th, at 7:00 p.m. In addition, you may have a few hours of free time at the Fair Thursday and Friday afternoons.

You are not excused to leave the hotel during the entire competition unless you have signed a release form. Travel must be approved by the coordinator and the queen's guardians.

Transportation:

Transportation will be provided from the hotel to the fairgrounds and back each day except after the crowning. At that time, contestants can return to the hotel with family/friends to pick up their belongings. However, contestant's belongings can be picked up at the hotel before the coronation. All contestants are to check out by 2:00 p.m. (tentative) on Saturday, August 12th but will remain with the chaperones until after the coronation.

Meals:

The Iowa State Fair provides meals for the contestants. A variety of snacks and drinks will be available in the hospitality suite. Any additional items, such as ordered food and snacks at the fair, are at your expense. If there are any health concerns or food requirements, the coordinator must be contacted prior to check-in.

Clothing:

Except during free time at the hotel, your crown and sash are to be worn throughout the entire contest (including free time at the fair). You will wear **Formal Wear** for part of the judging and the crowning (prom dresses are acceptable). You may wear the same formal each time. You will also need **Business Interview Attire**, which may include a business suit or a professional dress and **Casual wear** such as capris, dresses or skirts. You may want to bring a couple of different **Casual Wear** outfits as you will be wearing those outfits at the fair and for judging.

Workshops:

There will be several workshops scheduled throughout the week. Though we cannot require you to attend each workshop, we strongly urge you to do so. Several talented people donate their time and materials to make this event memorable.

In addition, a select few of the workshops may involve items that you can purchase. For example, you may attend a Mary Kay workshop. At the end of the workshop, you will have the opportunity to purchase makeup or skin care products. Queens are not required to purchase anything at these workshops, it is only offered.

Note: Please forward these rules and regulations to your queen when selected.

2023 IOWA STATE FAIR QUEEN COMPETITION RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Each contestant must be female and at least 16 years of age and not more than 21 years of age on Aug 10, the first day of the 2023 Iowa State Fair.
2. Contestants must never have been married.
3. A county fair queen must reside in the county she represents or an adjoining county if the majority of her activities are in the county she represents. If a fair represents more than one county, the winning contestant must reside in one of the participating counties.
4. Each contestant must be an active member of at least one service organization in her community such as a church group, Girl Scouts, 4-H, FFA, etc. (Eligibility is not limited to 4-H or FFA membership.)
5. Each entrant in the State Fair Competition must be selected from a competitive queen contest at her county fair. If an Iowa fair does not have a contest, it may sanction another queen contest in their county as the "Official County Fair Queen Contest." The winner of this is then eligible to compete at the Iowa State Fair. Only contests sponsored by county fairs that are members of the Association of Iowa Fairs will be eligible to compete at the state level.
6. Only winners as indicated under Rule 5 are eligible to represent counties at the state pageant. In the event the county queen is unable to participate, alternates will be considered in order of selection.
7. No professional model (one who has had ongoing employment in which modeling was the primary part of the job) is eligible to compete in the state competition.
8. Any contestant who has competed at the Iowa State Fair Queen level of the competition may not compete again.
9. Any county fair queen selected after the 2022 Iowa State Fair and meeting the above qualifications is eligible for the 2023 competition. The only exception to this rule would be the Counties that crown either just before or during the current Iowa State Fair and then will compete the following year.
10. The Iowa State Fair will accept only one entry per county. Should there be more than one queen contest in the county, it will be the responsibility of the fairs concerned to hold an elimination contest. The only exception to this rule will be in those counties where more than one fair qualifies for membership with the Association of Iowa Fairs. In those cases, both fairs will be eligible to submit candidates for the competition.
11. It is the responsibility of each contestant to make arrangements for transportation to and from Des Moines.
12. The county fair queens will be the guests of the Iowa State Fair Tuesday, August 8th, through the time of the crowning Saturday evening, August 12th, 2023.

13. The Iowa State Fair will provide a sash and crown for each county fair to award their queen at the county fair. This must be worn when she appears at the Iowa State Fair and is included in the \$450.00 entry fee requested with the enclosed entry blank. Entry fee for entries received after April 30 is \$500.00. Absolutely NO entries will be accepted after May 31!

14. County fairs are requested to select their candidates by competition in which personality, leadership, and overall appearance and poise are judged.

15. A competent committee will select the "Iowa State Fair Queen". Judging comments are not available to the contestants or county representatives. Judging will be based on the following:

Personality, Attitude, Appearance and Awareness
Leadership and Citizenship - Contribution to Community
Overall Appearance, Charm, Poise

16. Each contestant should be prepared to appear in a variety of dress such as business attire, evening dress, and casual wear.

17. The winner of the state competition will be crowned "2023 Iowa State Fair Queen." The 2023 Queen will be required to remain at the Fairgrounds for the remaining time of the 2023 Fair.

18. The winner of the state competition must agree to appear for the Iowa State Fair in official capacities as requested throughout the year until her successor is crowned. This includes daily appearances at the 2023 Fair and the first three days at the 2024 Fair. The Iowa State Fair will help with food and transportation expenses for these appearances.

19. If the winner cannot reign until a new queen is crowned at the 2024 Fair, she must forfeit her title and all awards associated with it to the first runner-up.

20. The winning contestant at the Iowa State Fair must agree to accept no other queen titles nor endorse any commercial product as "Iowa State Fair Queen" for a period of 12 months following the 2023 Iowa State Fair without the written permission of the Iowa State Fair Board.

21. The winning contestant will receive all the prizes at the time of the finals with the exception of the scholarships. The scholarships will be presented to her after the 2024 Iowa State Fair Queen is selected.

22. The reigning 2023 "Iowa State Fair Queen" is expected to conduct herself in a manner that reflects positively on herself, her family, and on the Iowa State Fair. Should the reigning "Iowa State Fair Queen" become involved in any activity, including a drug, alcohol, or tobacco related offense that reflects negatively on herself, her family, or the Iowa State Fair, she may be required to forfeit her crown, title, and rights to the scholarship award to the first runner-up.

23. Should the 2023 "Iowa State Fair Queen" marry or become ineligible before the 2024 queen is crowned, she will forfeit her title, crown, and rights to the scholarship award to the first runner-up. Should the first runner-up marry or become ineligible, she will forfeit title, crown and rights to the scholarship to the second runner-up.

24. The Iowa State Fair Board reserves the right to change and interpret the foregoing rules and regulations at any time as may be deemed expedient.
