- 1. Entries: hand or machine quilted old or new quilts in the following categories:

  - C. Appliquéd
  - D. Baby Quilt
- E. Wall Hangings
- F. Lap Quilts
- G. Pillows
- 2. Use a separate entry form for each quilt. Attach a 4"x 6" identification label to the front side of the quilt, indicating the name, phone number, address, name of quilt, and history.
- 3. Security will be provided in the evenings, and the building will be securely locked. The quilts will be treated with the utmost care, but the Committee is not responsible for damage or loss. Quilt show entrants will sign in at entry time and sign out at pickup time.

#### **OPEN CLASS FLORAL HALL/GENERAL RULES**

- 1. Entry: Thursday, July 10, 8 am 12 noon. NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER NOON.
- 2. Exhibitors classified into 3 groups:
  - Senior (age 17 and older)
  - Junior (ages 11 16)

Young Child (age 10 and younger)

- Judging: Thursday, July 10, 1:00 pm Building will be closed during judging. Checkout: Sunday, July 13, 3:30-4:00 pm Not responsible for articles left after 5 pm on Sunday. Exhibits leaving early will forfeit premium money.
- 4. An exhibitor is limited to TWO entries in each class.
- 5. No extra classifications will be made.
- 6. Any item winning a Best of Show or blue ribbon at this fair will not be eligible for competition in the following years.
- 7. All entries will receive a ribbon and premium worthy of their merit; unworthy items will not receive a ribbon or premium. There can be more than one blue ribbon in each class. However, if no entry in that class is worthy, a blue ribbon does not have to be awarded.
- 8. The judge's decision will determine Best of Show in each division.
- 9. Individual departments will follow general rules and may add rules specific to each division.

Ribbon values: Blue \$1; Red \$.75; Best of Show \$4

All baked items will be sold after judging unless the exhibitor requests at the time of entry not to do so. Proceeds will go to the Adair County Fair.

Canned products must be canned in standard colorless jars and two-piece lids made for home canning, with the new metal screw bands left on. NOT ALLOWED: Two-quart jars, tall slender jars, mayonnaise-type jars, or bottles.

All canned products must be made from scratch by the entrant.

Canned goods will be judged on quality, variety, and appearance.

Some canned products may be opened and tasted, as identified by the subject. Opened jars will be placed under refrigeration for the remainder of the Fair.
